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What Is Instructional Program Review?

- A process of analysis and assessment of MVC program and discipline effectiveness.
 - Identifying and reflecting on short and long-term goals program-specific goals.
 - An opportunity to document and request resources to assist your program in meeting its goals.
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What Is Instructional Program Review?

- Comprehensive Reports
 - Due every 3 years.
 - Involves detailed analysis of discipline data, three-year goal setting and follow up.
 - Verification that CORs and SLOs are updated.
 - Annual Reports
 - Due annually
 - Short narrative on major changes and updates
 - Verify that CORs and SLOs are up to date
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Goals and Purpose of IPR

- Student Success
 - Understand who our students are
 - Highlight what our programs have accomplished
 - Identify areas of success and needed improvement
 - Identify resource needs to support continued and improved student success
 - Shared governance and institutional service
 - Faculty-driven process for program evaluation and goal setting
 - RCCD faculty contract sets an expectation of five hours of institutional service per week
 - Includes participating in program review, assessment, and preparing reports
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What's Included in IPR

- Review of discipline/program Mission Statement and align to college mission
 - Report major developments and changes from the last year
 - Ensure all course SLOs have been assessed within the last 4-years
 - Ensure CORs have been updated within 4-years, 2-years for CTE
 - Data Analysis Component
 - Evaluate how SLO results are being used in teaching and learning
 - Complete Program Learning Outcome Mapping
 - Request resources via the online resource request form in Nuventive by the Fall Program Review deadline
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Timeline for IPR Process

- October 1st deadline for both comprehensive and annual reports
 - The IPR Committee (IPRC) begins reviewing submitted reports the first week of October.
 - Faculty are notified and welcome to attend public meetings when their report is reviewed.
 - Revisions may be requested by the IPRC or the report may be accepted without revisions.
 - Revisions can be made and submitted up to 2 weeks after the initial review.
 - Administration will read completed reports, may provide feedback, and consider resource requests for the following year.

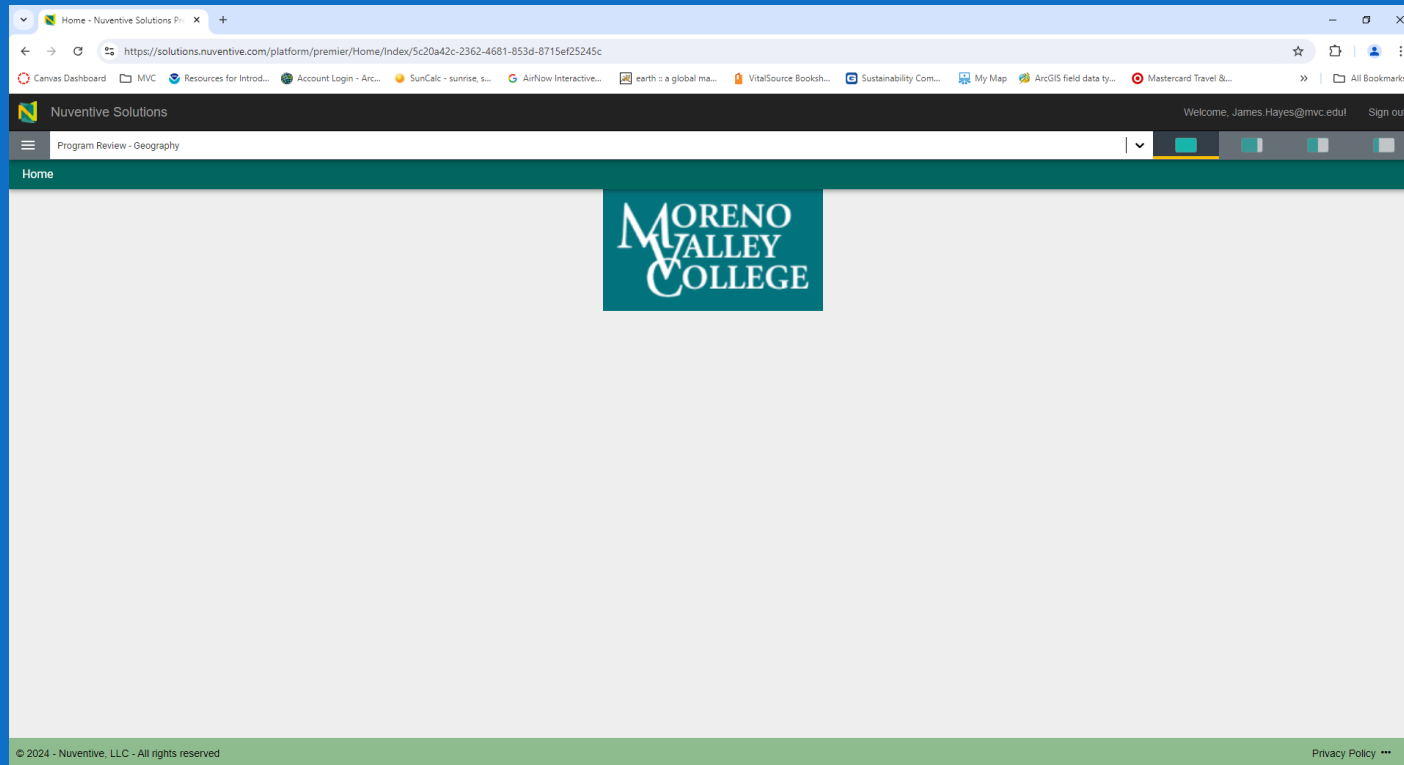
