




# Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF)




- 70% from Base allocation (enrollment)
- 20% from *Supplemental* allocation (College Promise Grant, students receiving a Pell Grant, and students covered by AB 540)
  - 10% from **Student Success** allocation (transfers, certificates and degree completion)

# **Enrollments - By Modality**






## Course Success and Retention Rates







# ALMA Space Utilization Study (2024) Implementation Efforts


- 9 portables in Parkside Complex (PSC) decommissioned. Equates to 8,100 ASF.
- 4 portables in PSC will be decommissioned by January 2025. Equates to 3,108 ASF.
- 7 portables in PSC and 2 restroom portables will remain.
- Relocating office spaces for faculty
- Disconnect power, water, and HVAC to reduce costs in the decommissioned PSCs.
- Repurposing two computerized and underutilized rooms (Summer 2024).
- Placing large lecture courses in appropriately sized classrooms (Ongoing).
- Align class caps with the appropriate classrooms (Ongoing).







### **Current Enrollment Picture for 2024-25**




