

Open Campus - Class and Study Time 2021-2022

Riverside Community College District offers the Open Campus to distribute Distance Education programs, such as, online, hybrid, and web-enhanced courses. The goal of the Distance Education programs is to make learning available anytime, anywhere for students who find it difficult to meet on campus at scheduled class times.

Open Campus courses (on-line and hybrid) are academically equivalent to on-campus courses, <u>requiring the same number of hours in attendance per week</u>, and fulfill RCCD General Education, elective, and/or major requirements, with many classes transferable to four-year institutions.

- Online (ONLN) no scheduled meeting days: Online classes are distance education classes with no scheduled meeting days. Students will log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.
- Regular Meeting (REG MEET) Specific days/times: Distance education classes with regular weekly meeting(s) during scheduled days and times. Students will attend class online during the published course times. Additionally, students will log in to Canvas and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.
- Occasional Meeting (OCC MEET) Specific days/times: Distance education classes with
 occasional meetings during scheduled days and times. Students will occasionally attend class online
 during the published course times. Additionally, students will log in to Canvas and complete work
 regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete
 coursework.
- Face to Face (F2F): Face to Face classes are in-person and on-campus classes with weekly scheduled meeting days and times. Students will complete the semester on campus unless the college is ordered to discontinue face-to-face classes. If face-to-face courses are discontinued, and the course cannot be completed through distance education, it will be canceled.
- **Hybrid (HYB):** Hybrid classes are distance education courses combined with on-campus face-to-face classes that will meet on required scheduled meetings days and times unless the college is ordered to discontinue face-to-face classes. If face-to-face courses are discontinued, and the course cannot be completed through distance education, it will be canceled. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.

Study Time

The number of hours given for unsupervised study time (one hour per week for each hour of class time) is the same for both traditional on-campus and Open Campus courses. For supervised study time, Riverside Community College District recommends students have 3 hours per week of study time for every unit of class time.

Below is a chart converting units to hours spent in class along with the recommended study time per term. The fall and spring semesters are 16 weeks, short-term courses are 8 weeks, and summer and winter terms are 6 weeks. To calculate hours per week divide hours per term by number of weeks in term. For example, 3 units - 54 hours/16 weeks (fall and spring) = 3.37 hours.
